In many cases, Chinese medicine and Western medicine can be used successfully and safely together, and by using their respective wisdoms and strengths, an entirely better system of healthcare can be formed.

THE FUTURE OF MEDICINE

Modern medicine will develop in the direction of scientific expertise combined with a holistic understanding of disease patterns, creating a new kind of medical practitioner. Who will be the new integrative physicians of the future? They will be those with knowledge of a wide range of medical systems, who are able to treat patients by the most appropriate means for their individual conditions. By combining the technical expertise of Western trained doctors with the holistic wisdom of Chinese medical physicians, medicine can continue advancing to the next level. Ultimately, it will only be through education and the mutual sharing of knowledge and clinical experience that these new integrative physicians can be created.

COURSE OVERVIEW

The MSc. Chinese Medicine and Acupuncture is a unique opportunity for students to study at Ballsbridge University. This programme combines instruction with independent study and is taught to distance, giving students the chance to experience Chinese medicine and culture first hand.

Candidates must have experience of conducting independent clinical research and practice in the relevant fields and of conducting scientific research of Chinese medicine.

Students are not required to have any knowledge of spoken or written Mandarin Chinese as all modules will be taught in English.

Students are required to take nine taught modules and complete a 30,000 word dissertation.

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Ph.D. Chinese Medicine and Acupuncture is a course which offers students the chance to conduct research at Ballsbridge University whilst also giving them full access to the advanced clinical facilities of the Oriental Medicine Institute from Argentina (optional fellowship). This innovative Ph.D. programme combines modular study and clinical practice (optional).

The Ph.D. programme's research and clinical basis allows students to further their knowledge and understanding of Chinese medicine and acupuncture and to contribute towards a more integrated healthcare.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must have an approved Masters qualification in Chinese medicine, Western medicine, or other related discipline to enrol on this course.

Candidates must also have good working knowledge of systematic theory in traditional Chinese medicine, acupuncture, and tuina, as well as a systematic command of fundamental theory and diagnostic skills in traditional Chinese medicine and acupuncture. Candidates must have experience of conducting independent clinical research and practice in the relevant fields and of conducting scientific research of Chinese medicine.

Students are not required to have any knowledge of spoken or written Mandarin Chinese as all modules will be taught in English.

STRUCTURE

Students are required to take six taught modules and complete a 50,000 word dissertation.

Once the dissertation has been completed, students will must to send the thesis to Ballsbridge University for evaluation. Students approved will receive the certificate with the transcript.
